


Faculty Review of Open eTextbooks



- The textbook provides a very good background of the most relevant concepts in information systems and their evolution. It serves as a very good foundation for other more modern topics. Some concepts about technology could be outdated but that is intrinsic to the technology world.
- Because the book covers the most relevant concepts, it could be used not only for a lower division course but also for an upper division undergraduate courses.
- The book covers topics related to information systems and their role in business and defines topics such as
 database management systems, networking, ethics and security, computer systems hardware and
 software components. There is little about e-commerce and there are no hands-on projects developing
 computer-based solutions to business problems. Those will have to be added by the instructor.
- The book does not provide practical exercises in electronic spreadsheet development, the use of database software or Internet technologies.
- Some chapters have industry cases for discussion like the case of Walmart but that is not available in all chapters.

- The book is well organized and straight to the point. Each chapter has learning objectives, a brief summary of the chapter at the end and study questions for every chapter. Only some chapters offer additional exercises. In addition, the answer to the study questions are available at the end of the book.
- Ancillary materials such as test banks, activities and exercises and pedagogical apparatus should be developed by the instructors. The book only has study questions with answers for each chapter.
- There are no instructions or specific help for the instructor as such. However, this can be seen as an opportunity for instructors to be develop their own teaching styles using this book as the foundation.
- The textbook provides only text and few images to the topics covered.
